Welcome to the Sheriff's Office

After alternating between Patrol and Narcotics, Deputy Tempalsky retired from the LPD as a Lieutenant in the Narcotics Division.

Deputy Tempalsky will be assigned to the Uniform Patrol Division as a patrol officer for the GCSO.

In February 2008, Sergeant Bardon got promoted to Corporal of his shift within the Patrol Division. In his new capacity as Sergeant, he will be in command of his assigned shift. He will be responsible for all field operations which take place during his shift, including supervising assigned deputies, delegating assignments, evaluating and approving reports, and any other issues that may arise.

Sergeant Bardon is a native of Georgetown.

Deputy Reginald Grant was transferred to the Organized Crime Bureau (OCB)—Narcotics Division in March 2009, by Sheriff Cribb. Agent Grant began with the sheriff's office in August 2006 as a Patrol Deputy. Prior to that, he volunteered with the sheriff's office for 8 years.

Sheriff Announces Promotion and Transfers

In March 2009, Sheriff Lane Cribb promoted Corporal Jared Bardon to the rank of Sergeant in the Uniform Patrol Division. Sergeant Bardon began with the sheriff's office in January 2006, after serving 2.5 years with the Liberty Police Department in Liberty, South Carolina. He was hired as a patrol officer in Liberty in August 2003 while he was working on his Bachelors Degree in Management from Clemson University. He graduated in 2004.

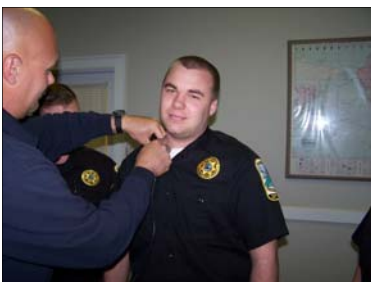
Corporal Lynn Picard
