Murrells Inlet Woman Charged with 3 Counts of ABWIK

(Murrells Inlet, SC)---Georgetown County Sheriff's Investigators charged 42-year-old Lisa Leger of 4826 Highway 17 Business, Murrells Inlet, with 3 counts of Assault and Battery with the Intent to Kill and Leaving the Scene with Property Damage yesterday afternoon. This intentional motor vehicle collision occurred just before the second motor vehicle collision Leger was involved in at the intersection of US 17 Business and Wachesaw Road.

Tuesday evening, January 27, 2009, shortly after 7:00, Georgetown County Sheriff's Deputies responded to the corner of Mariner Avenue and US 17 Business for a motor vehicle collision involving a hit & run. Once on scene sheriff's deputies discovered that Leger's ex-boyfriend, Gregory Martin, his niece, Nicole Rodgers, and her infant child was in a vehicle that was struck from behind by Leger who was driving a Dodge truck. After they were struck from behind by Leger, Rodgers lost control of the vehicle, ran off of the roadway and struck a tree.

The incident began when Leger called Martin to ask him if he would meet her at the Kangaroo, on US 17 Business in Murrells Inlet, and give her a ride. When they arrived at the Kangaroo, they saw Leger was driving and did not need a ride. When Leger was confronted, she became angry and began yelling in the parking lot.

In an effort to prevent further incident, they left the store headed south on US 17 Business. This is when Leger came up behind them and struck them from behind. Martin and the infant suffered minor injuries from the collision.

While at the scene, sheriff's deputies put out a BOLO for Leger and the vehicle she was driving. Shortly after, while still on the scene, sheriff's deputies heard the crash from the second motor vehicle collision.

Leger was transported to the Georgetown County Detention Center after she was released from the Waccamaw Hospital yesterday. She is currently being held under a \$25,570.00 cash/surety bond.
